MATERIAL LIST

- Art spectrum Original Colourfix paper 9 x A3 size:
 Colours-3 Soft Umber; 2 White, 1 Blue Haze, 1 Rose Grey, 1 Australian Grey, 1 Sand
- Pastels: Soft Pastels of a professional standard, for example: Art Spectrum round, Unison, Mt Vision or Sennelier; Bring whatever soft pastels you have in your collection. If you don't have a good variety of colours and tones, I recommend you purchase this set: Art Spectrum round soft pastels: box of 40 half stick assorted pastels
- Easel either standing or table
- Backing Board A3 size or larger, can be a smooth foamcore sheet, or board padded with paper (2 foamcore sheets can be used as a folder to transport your paper and paintings, held together with bulldog clips, glassine paper between paintings)
- Clips and masking tape to secure paper to board
- A4 visual diary and a pen for note taking
- Vine or willow charcoal, and a kneadable eraser
- Graphite pencils for sketching, rubber, sharpener
- Dust catcher make from sheet of folded Alfoil to place under board.
- Wet Wipes
- 2 old bath towels 1 to fold and place on table under your pastels, and the other to put on the floor.
- Small bottle of rubbing alcohol (from chemist)
- 2 paint brushes, eg 1 inch flat or filbert bristle brush, size 8 round brush, size isn't critical, we can share brushes if necessary for some underpainting techniques
- Reference photos, either on an iPad or tablet, or printed at 8x10 inch sized.

I will supply photographs for our still life paintings, using a single light source, so that we can easily see light and shadow shapes.

Bring some photographs of floral subjects that inspire you and some landscapes with a large, interesting skies with clouds. Good lighting in your photographs is important, to distinguish light and shade.
